**FEATURE CAR:**

"You in a Heap of Trouble, Boy."

Many thanks to my friend, officer Jim Ritter, Seattle Police, for agreeing to play the part of Sheriff Joe Higgins in our remake of the famous 1970 Dodge Challenger TV commercial. I thought Jim did a great job considering he didn't have a Southern accent, a Stetson or a cigar. What he did bring to the party (Spring Roundup) were two authentic vintage Mopar police cruisers from the Seattle Metropolitan Police Museum which he founded. (<http://www.cityofseattle.net/tour/policemuseum.htm>) Thanks, Jim!

But I digress. Here is how I became the curator for a 1970 Dodge Challenger SE. In the early '90s when I was commuting from Lynnwood to downtown Seattle, I would notice guys commuting in first generation Mustangs and Camaros. I thought to myself, "These guys aren't so dumb. They got a good looking ride, easy to work on. All they have to do is maintain them and they will never lose a dime." I said, "I could do that, but I would have to have a 'Cuda or a Challenger." I went to a Mopars Unlimited meeting at Shakey's Pizza on Aurora and joined the club. I stood up at a meeting and told everyone that I was looking for a 'Cuda or a Challenger. They laughed at me.

Over the next few months, I looked at a couple of Challengers and passed on both. One was at an auction in Woodinville. It was a '70 from the doors forward, but the rest of the car was '72,3, or 4. Then I saw this ad in the Auto Trader.

'70 Dodge Challenger SE. AT, PS, AC, leather buckets, overhead console, lemon twist yellow, 57,000 mi., all #s match, new carb, shocks, radial TAs, spare never used, outstanding orig. cond. \$5,000, cash.

I went to look at the car. It was sitting outside and dirty, but otherwise in great condition. The owner was a guy named Joe Rambo - I swear I am not making this up! Anyway, Joe had the Challenger, a Buick Gran Sport, a Datsun Z car, two motorcycles, and no garage. He wasn't there when I went to look at the car so I called and left him a message. When he called back I asked him if it was still available. He said "Yes, but I had a minor accident. I hit a post and bent the front bumper, the valance, the gravel pan, the hood, and the left front fender. But I got a repair estimate from the dealer and I will take it off the price." My response was, "Joe, I just don't have time to deal with it." He called me back about a week later and said, "Come over and drive the car. We can make a deal." I did and we did. On

November 12<sup>th</sup>, 1991, I became the curator for a numbers-matching, Top Banana Yellow, big-block 1970 Dodge Challenger SE.

At the next Mopars Unlimited meeting I asked for recommendations for a body shop to do the repairs. Ray Guardiano and Bruce Herbig came over to my garage to look at it. They told me it was too nice and too rare to be a commuter car. It never was.

Over the years many Mopars Unlimited members and former members have helped me with it: ACME (Bob Kropp & Michael Jenkins), Brent Kosche, Tim Morisset, Steve Wilson and his brother-in-law Dan, Bob Morton, Jeff Carter, Dave Curtis, Bill Lowe, Scooter, Steve Blackwell, Greg Peck, the Bedsworths...and if I didn't mention you, it was my senior moment!
